The minor in Comparative and Critical Race and Ethnic Studies is designed to introduce students to the history and politics of racial formation by bringing together courses from multiple departments engaged in the analysis, cultural history, and political economy of race and migration. PLEASE CHECK:

- an introductory course (050:102) in comparative race and ethnic studies offered in American Studies OR an approved 100- or 200- level course in African American, US Latina/o, Native American or Asian American history or literary tradition;
- one course in non-US or global processes of racial and ethnic formation; and
- four more courses on race and ethnicity, TWO of which must deal with two different historical racial groupings (African American, Native, Latino, Asian American, Mixed) or in comparative context.

The CCRES MINOR is comprised of SIX (6) courses: THREE above 300-level and THREE additional courses at any level, including an introductory survey and a global course.
